A. EXECUTIVE SESSION MEMORANDA

B. NOTICE OF MEETING MAILED AND POSTED

Trustee Michael Dora, Secretary, confirmed that the notice of the regular meetings on April 3, 2025, was properly mailed and posted. The public was invited to attend the meetings, which were open to the public.

C. <u>APPROVAL OF BOARD MINUTES</u>

Trustee Gutman moved to approve the board meeting minutes from February 6, 2025. Trustee Emmert O'Dell seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

D. COMMITTEE REPORTS

Item 1: Chair Wilson noted the Audit Committee did not meet, and there is no committee report.

Item 2: Chair Wilson called upon Trustee Dekker to give the **Workforce & Careers Committee** report. Trustee Dekker reported there is one action item for consideration and board approval.

In her committee report this morning, Senior Vice President Dodge provided an overview of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) and its evolution, highlighting how Ivy Tech Community College continues to serve as a leader in Indiana's public workforce system.

As a strategic partner, a Title II adult education provider, and a WIOA-approved training provider, Ivy Tech plays a vital role in connecting Hoosiers to in-demand careers through skills-based education and workforce-aligned training.

As part of her report, Senior Vice President Dodge also presented a resolution for the Board to consider to formally approve and endorse Ivy Tech's commitment to serving military-affiliated students through participation in the Purple Star initiative.

Trustee Dekker moved to approve Resolution 2025-13, Approval of Statement of Commitment to Military-Affiliated Students. Trustee Band seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Additionally, Ivy Tech released a landmark study estimating—for the first time—the number of Hoosiers who will need to upskill through non-degree credentials to meet Indiana's future workforce demands and support economic growth over the next decade.

The report, *Indiana's Workforce Transformation: Understanding the Need for Upskilling and Reskilling in a Changing Economy*, outlines the significant demand for non-credit skills training across key sectors, including advanced manufacturing; business, logistics, and supply chain; healthcare; and technology. It finds that 69% of job openings in these sectors will require education beyond high school but less than a four-year degree. To meet this demand, Indiana will need to upskill or reskill more than 82,000 working adults each year through non-degree credentials.

Item 3: Chair Wilson called upon Trustee Dora to give the <u>Academics & Student Experience</u> <u>Committee</u> report. Trustee Dora reported there are no action items for consideration, and board approval.

Shakira Grubbs updated the board about the college's enrollment. Enrollment for the 2024-2025 academic year is currently at over 203,000 students – an increase of over 8,000 students from the previous year, well above the strategic plan enrollment goal and over 40,000 students above where the college was just three years ago. Thirteen campuses have already exceeded their enrollment goals. Spring, Summer, and Fall enrollment are all running well ahead of previous years.

Dr. Bryan Hamann reported that retention continues to improve at the college, with an increase in fall-to-spring retention above last year for the third consecutive year. Seven campuses are currently exceeding their retention goals for Spring. Fall-to-fall retention for next year is currently running over three percentage points ahead of last year, which was the highest on record.

Dr. Rebecca Rahschulte reported on the College's HLC accreditation processes, timelines, aligned initiatives, and the institution's programmatic accreditation efforts that drive program quality and outcomes.

Dr. Katie Lash presented alongside special guest Steve Baker about K14 partnerships and the many ways our campuses support high schools. Mr. Baker, principal at Bluffton High School and longtime executive board member for the Indiana Association of School Principals, shared optimism about the work ahead in implementing the new high school diploma.

Item 4: Chair Wilson called upon Trustee Brand to give the <u>Finance & Budget Affairs</u> <u>Committee</u> report. Trustee Brand reported there is one action item for consideration and board approval.

Chief Financial Officer Dom Chase provided updates on the following items: State appropriations, Wage inflation update, CHE Tuition projection and Fiscal Year Budget Update.

We also had one presentation this morning from the Office of Information Technology.

Matt Etchison, senior vice President and CIO, recommended renewing our Oracle Software Maintenance agreement for one year at \$1,352,296.61. Oracle database software is required to run Ellucian's Banner platform.

Trustee Brand moved to approve Resolution 2025-12, Approval of a One-Year Agreement with Oracle America, INC. Trustee Gutman seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Courtney Roberts, Foundation President, provided an update on Fiscal Year 2025, Campaign Planning, and Ivy Tech Day, Tuesday, April 8.

Item 5: Chair Wilson called upon Trustee Emmert O'Dell to give the <u>Marketing & Public Affairs</u> <u>Committee</u> Report. Trustee Emmert O'Dell reported no action items for consideration and board approval.

Vice President of Marketing Kathie Fleck reported on the partnership between Ivy Tech and WISH TV & WXIN in Indianapolis. Each month for 6 months, we have a three-minute segment on each station's lifestyle programs. She also showed the ads for a new campaign marketing to see if they can help encourage new first-time adult students who have applied to take the step and register for classes. We learned about a new Dual Credit/Dual Enrollment ad campaign designed to target parents, teachers, and counselors to encourage them to enroll students. This is a result of Ivy Tech's research with young males in Indiana. Finally, she outlined the new Salesforce Marketing Cloud Intelligence dashboard, which now enables the marketing team to view the entire student recruitment journey in one place.

Emily Sandeberg, Assistant Vice President of Communications, shared the College's plans to observe National Community College Month this April via earned and social media. Sandberg shared the College's plans to amplify the findings of the TEConomy white paper on Inside Indiana Business and in local campus media markets. Campuses have been provided an op-ed template and a social media toolkit, and the communications team has developed a toolkit for Trustees. Item 6: Chair Wilson called upon Trustee Stemler to give the **Building, Grounds & Capital Committee** Report. Trustee Stemler reported there are eight action items for consideration and board approval.

Trustee Stemler moved to approve Resolution 2025-05, Approval to Grant an Easement to the Town of Sellersburg, Sellersburg Campus. Trustee Gutman seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Trustee Stemler moved to approve Resolution 2025-06, Approval to Advertise for Sale the Perkins Technology Center Building, Sellersburg Campus. Trustee Brand seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Trustee Stemler moved to approve Resolution 2025-07, Approval of a Contract Amendment for a Final Guaranteed Maximum Price with Pepper Construction, Indianapolis Campus. Trustee Lugbill seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Trustee Stemler moved to approve Resolution 2025-08, Approval of Contract for Windows in North Meridian Center Section 1965, Indianapolis Campus. Trustee Gutman seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Item 7: Chair Wilson provided a report from the <u>Search Committee</u>. With the assistance of our search firm, Isaacson Miller, we reached out to close to 200 prospects and potential sources nationwide. 33 applications were narrowed down to five semi-finalists. The board will interview three finalists. He thanked the Search Committee members and the Board for their continued diligence in the process, noting they are excited for this next phase of the search and remain on the same timeline they committed to from the beginning.

E. TREASURER'S REPORT

Chair Wilson called Dom Chase, CFO and Treasurer, to provide the Treasurer's Report.

Dom Chase reports that Ivy Tech Community College remains financially strong as we enter the final quarter of the fiscal year. Revenues continue to track with expectations, and we remain focused on prudent expense management to ensure a balanced year-end close.

As the legislative session nears its conclusion, we continue to monitor developments that may impact state appropriations. While fiscal constraints persist at the state level, Ivy Tech will respond accordingly to maintain financial stability.

At the federal level, recent policy changes have introduced uncertainties that could affect higher education funding nationwide. While Ivy Tech has experienced some limited impact, we are closely monitoring the fluid situation and proactively assessing broader implications.

I look forward to working with the Board between now and our June meeting to establish tuition and fees for the next two academic years that continue to balance affordability with the needs of our students and the long-term sustainability of the College.

We appreciate the Board's ongoing support as we continue to balance affordability, quality, and long-term financial sustainability.

Trustee Brand moved to approve the Treasurer's Report. Trustee Lugbill seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

F. STATE OF THE COLLEGE

Chair Wilson invited President Ellspermann to provide her State of the College report.

Ivy Tech President Sue Ellspermann highlighted student-led initiatives, strategic progress, and recent accomplishments in her President's Report. The 2024-25 Student Government Association State Legacy Project is central to the report, which focused on gathering student feedback to improve mental health resources and promote a sense of belonging. Based on qualitative responses from over 1,000 students across 19 campuses, the initiative recommends a statewide peer mentorship program and a centralized Ivy Learn course shell to connect students with mental health support. Ellspermann highlighted Ivy Tech's national advocacy efforts, such as testifying before Congress and participating in SXSW EDU, recognizing campuses meeting enrollment and retention goals, and celebrating staff embodying the College's core values through OneSummit Awards. Lastly, Ellspermann provided updates on the Strategic Plan and School Spotlights while bidding farewell to Provost McCurdy as he transitions to the presidency of Colby-Sawyer College.

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration awarded the Campus a grant to help fund the Lab; and

WHERAS, the Lab will house the equipment necessary to simulate a modern advanced manufacturing facility, including technologies which utilize equipment interconnectivity, smart sensors, and data security; and

WHERAS, the RFP process resulted in three prospective bidders joining a pre-bidder conference and ultimately two vendor proposals; and

WHEREAS, after review and evaluation of the proposals, the Campus selected Williams Crowe Inc. dba Aidex Corporation ("Williams Crowe") as best meeting the needs of the Campus, and

WHEREAS, the proposed cost of equipment and related goods and services to be provided by Williams Crowe is \$1,004,269.05, and

WHEREAS, the Campus seeks permission to enter into an agreement with Williams Crowe for the purchase of the equipment and related goods and services as proposed in the response to the RFP; and

WHEREAS, the State Board of Trustees must approve any contract imposing a financial obligation on the part of the College exceeding \$500,000 unless the obligation was previously approved by the Board through the allocation of funds.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the State Board of Trustees hereby approves the College entering into a contract with Williams Crowe for the purchase of the goods and services described herein, and

APPROVAL OF CONTRACT WITH TOUCHNET SYSTEMS OFFICE

RESOLUTION NUMBER 2025-19

WHEREAS, The Ivy Tech Community College College issued a Request for Proposal ("RFP") from multiple vendors for a payment processing platform;

WHEREAS, the College issued the RFP was to consolidate and increase efficiency in its methods of collecting payments of various types, and

WHEREAS, the RFP process resulted in five proposals from competing companies, and

WHEREAS, after review and evaluation of the written proposals, as well as presentations from selected Respondents, the College plans to contract with Touchnet to provide services for a term of five (5) years, and

WHEREAS, the College has contracted with Touchnet previously for many of the services to be provided under the proposed contract, and

WHEREAS, the new proposed contract amount for Fiscal Year 2026 represents savings of approximately \$16,586 over the amount the College would have otherwise paid to renew its current contract with Touchnet for Fiscal Year 2026 if the College had not run a competitive process, and

WHEREAS, in Year 1 of the proposed contract representing Fiscal Year 2026, the contract amount to be paid to Touchnet is \$169,250, with some potential variances based on usage, and

WHEREAS, the anticipated contract amount for the entire term is approximately \$900,000; the actual contract amount will ultimately vary based usage costs and on increases that are contractually capped at 3% annually; and

WHEREAS, the State Board of Trustees must approve any contract imposing a financial obligation on the part of the College exceeding \$500,000 unless the obligation was previously approved by the Board through the allocation of funds.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the State Board of Trustees hereby approves the College to enter into a contract with Touchnet for payment processing platform solutions, and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED, that the State Trustees do hereby authorize and direct the President or Treasurer, or other appropriate designated College employee, to execute the contract with said firm after the documents have been approved by College Counsel.

APPROVAL OF THE STUDENT TUITION AND FEE RATES FOR FISCAL YEARS 2025-2026 and 2026-2027

RESOULTION NUMBER 2025-20

WHEREAS, the State of Indiana requires all state supported colleges and universities to establish tuition and mandatory fees for a two-year period, and

WHEREAS, The College's in-state student fees are the lowest in Indiana amongst all state supported colleges and universities, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the in-state tuition will be \$178.38 per credit hour per semester for fewer than 12 credit hours and a flat rate of \$2,577.11 for 12 or more credit hours per semester for the 2025-2026 and 2026-2027 Fall, Spring and Summer Semesters. There will be no tuition charged for senior scholars; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the out-of-state tuition will be \$348.97 per credit hour per semester for fewer than 12 credit hours and a flat rate of \$4,967.51 for 12 or more credit hours per semester for the 2025-2026 and 2026-2027 Fall, Spring and Summer Semesters. and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an Ivy + course material fee of \$18 per credit hour will be assessed to all students for the provision of course materials for the 2025-2026 and 2026-2027 Fall, Spring and Summer Semesters with an opt-out allowance each semester for students; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that students enrollment in specific programs will be assessed programmatic fees as follows: \$125 per semester for students in the Nursing Program, the Practical Nursing Program or Dental Hygiene Program, \$900 per semester for students taking 12 or more hours in the Ivy Honors program, and \$750 per semester for students taking under 12 hours in the Ivy Honors program through the Spring 2025-2026 semester. These fees remain the same as in the prior biennium; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that these tuition and fees rates will remain effective for two years or until modified by the State Trustees.

WHEREAS, the 2025-2026 fiscal year internal operating budget for the College must be adopted, and

WHEREAS, the general fund unrestricted recurring operating revenue estimate for the 2025-2026 fiscal year, as recommended by the Ivy Tech administration, totals \$568,661,024 and general fund unrestricted operating reserve totals \$372,299,966, as illustrated on Exhibit A as attached, and

WHEREAS, the operating expenditure budget is within this revenue as projected, as illustrated on Exhibit B as attached, and

WHEREAS, additional restricted funds are anticipated, and expenditures are to be budgeted within these projections.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the State Board of Trustees does hereby approve the revenue estimates and budget allocations for the 2025-2026 fiscal year as attached (Exhibits A and B) at a total of \$940,960,990 and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that each budget allocation as hereby approved shall be adjusted by the Senior Vice President/Chief Financial Officer as authorized by the President after the year end 2024-2025 closing to reflect the actual revenue and expense budget of each such unit, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Senior Vice President/Chief Financial Officer, as directed by the President, shall affect a reduction or increase to these budget allocations as necessary to maintain a balanced budget for the fiscal year. Such action may occur whenever it is determined that budgeted revenue is not being collected as has been projected, to adjust for a significant shift in enrollment between campuses or sites, or to adjust for changes in other income or expenses. All such budget increases or decreases during the fiscal year shall be reported to the Board by the Senior Vice President/Chief Financial Officer at its next meeting subsequent to such action by the President, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the amounts included in the reserve accounts may be allocated to the respective campuses and sites as needed for the specified purposes by the Senior Vice President/Chief Financial Officer when approved by the President, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the restricted funds awarded to the College may be expended for their intended purposes within the mission of the College, and that addition of such funds will be reported to this Board by the Senior Vice President/Chief Financial Officer at its next board meeting, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that debt service funds may be expended for the payment of interest, principal reduction, or other related costs, and that expenditures in excess of \$500,000 will be reported to this Board at its next board meeting following such expenditure by the Senior Vice President/Chief Financial Officer, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that revenues received from Auxiliary Enterprises may be expended for their intended purpose of paying for the obligations of the Auxiliary Enterprises Fund, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board approves the annual allocation of funds for all utilities, local phone service and postage, the projected expenditure of \$59,900,000 for employee health savings accounts, health and dental insurances and administrative costs, and the specific contracts listed on Exhibit C attached that obligates the College to expenditures exceeding \$500,000 and authorizes the President to enter into such contracts with the vendors listed or with alternative vendors if circumstances warrant, with any such changes reported to the Board at its next regularly scheduled meeting.

RESOLUTION OF THE STATE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF IVY TECH COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF INDIANA TO AMEND THE IVY TECH COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF INDIANA DEFINED CONTRIBUTION RETIREMENT PLAN

RESOLUTION 2025-22

WHEREAS, Ivy Tech Community College of Indiana ("College") maintains the Ivy Tech Community College of Indiana Defined Contribution Retirement Plan ("Retirement Plan"), an Internal Revenue Code Section 403(b) plan, established effective January 1, 1969, to which the College makes employer contributions on behalf of eligible faculty, professional personnel, and support staff ("Eligible Employees").

WHEREAS, in connection with the College's freezing participation in the Indiana Public Employees' Retirement Fund ("PERF") effective July 1, 2014, the College amended the Retirement Plan to expand eligibility for Nonelective Contributions to include part-time employees who otherwise would have been required to participate in PERF.

WHEREAS, as a result of subsequent amendments to the PERF statutes, employees who are not offered a retirement plan by the College are no longer required to participate in PERF and, therefore, the College is no longer required to make Nonelective Contributions on behalf of part-time employees to avoid PERF participation.

WHEREAS, the College has reserved the right to amend the Retirement Plan at any time, by action of the State Board of Trustees of Ivy Tech Community College of Indiana ("Board of Trustees").

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees has determined it is desirable and in the best interests of the College to amend the Retirement Plan to (i) exclude part-time employees from the definition of Eligible Employee and limit such eligibility to employees of the College who are employed in a permanent position and regularly scheduled to work at least thirty-two (32) hours per week (e.g. is an eighty percent (80%) or more full time equivalent), subject to certain exclusions, effective June 30, 2025, and (ii) provide for the full and immediate vesting of part-time employees who met the definition of Eligible Employee and participated in the Plan on June 29, 2025, but no longer meet the definition of Eligible Employee under the Plan as amended effective June 30, 2025.

WHEREAS, the College maintains the Ivy Tech Community College of Indiana Supplemental 401(a) Plan ("Supplemental Plan"), an Internal Revenue Code Section 401(a) plan, established effective December 1, 2011, to which the College makes employer contributions on behalf of specified employees.

WHEREAS, President Sue Ellspermann, currently the sole participant in the Supplemental Plan, is retiring from the College on June 30, 2025.

WHEREAS, the College has reserved the right to terminate the Supplemental Plan at any time, by action of the Board of Trustees.

WHEREAS, the Board desires to terminate the Supplemental Plan effective December 31, 2025, and to direct the distribution of all assets held under the Supplemental Plan as soon as administratively practicable thereafter.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the College, by its Board of Trustees, approves and adopts Amendment Number One to the Ivy Tech Community College of Indiana Defined Contribution Retirement Plan, effective as stated therein, in the form and substance of a copy of the same which is attached hereto.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the College, by its Board of Trustees, hereby terminates the Supplemental Plan effective December 31, 2025, and directs the distribution of all assets thereunder as soon as administratively practicable thereafter.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the College, by its Board of Trustees, does hereby authorize and direct (i) the President of the College or her designee to execute Amendment Number One to the Ivy Tech Community College of Indiana Defined Contribution Retirement Plan, in the form attached hereto, on behalf of and in the name of the Board of Trustees, (ii) an authorized officer of the College to take all necessary action to effectuate the termination of the Supplemental Plan and the timely distribution of all Plan assets, and (iii) any additional actions that may be necessary or appropriate to implement the foregoing resolutions and administer the provisions of the Retirement Plan and/or to terminate the Supplemental Plan.

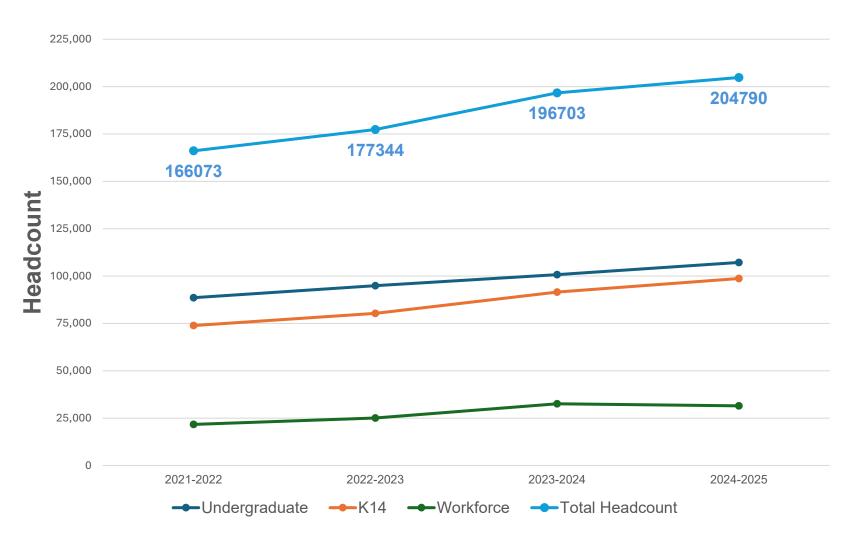

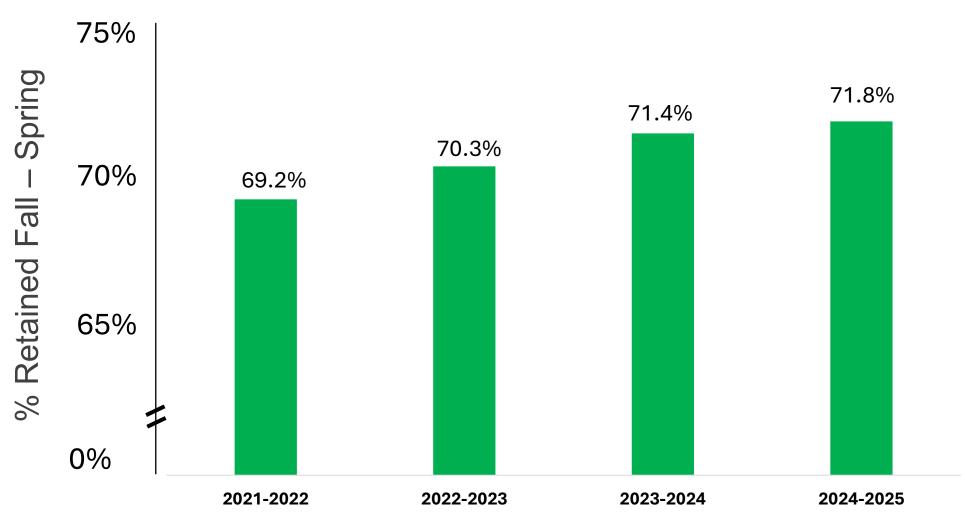
ENROLLMENT (POINT-IN-TIME) 2024-2025

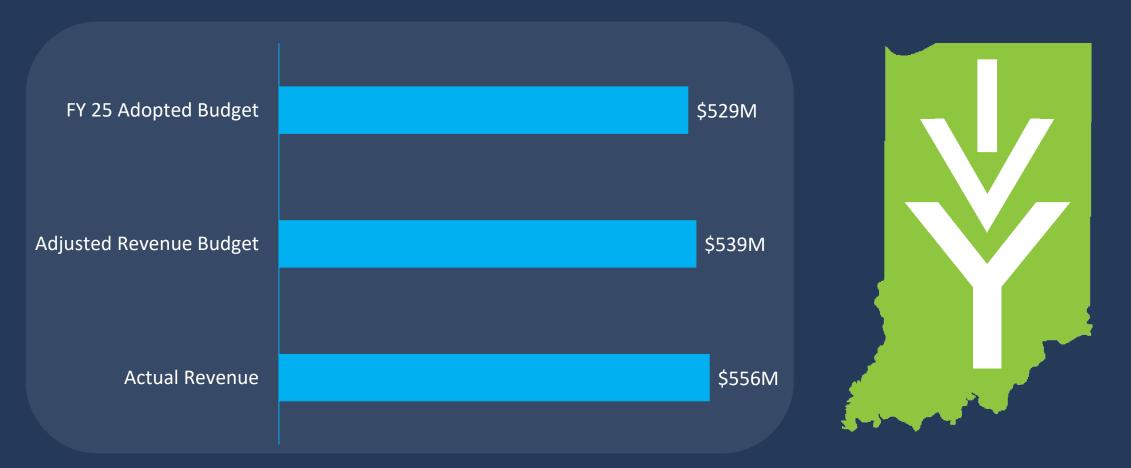

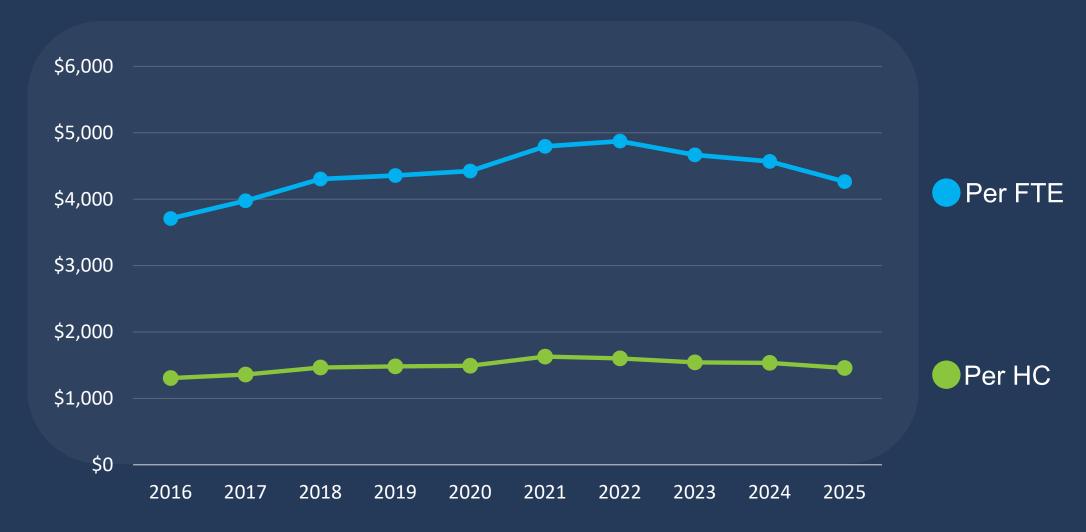
State Operating Appropriation





State Operating Per Student

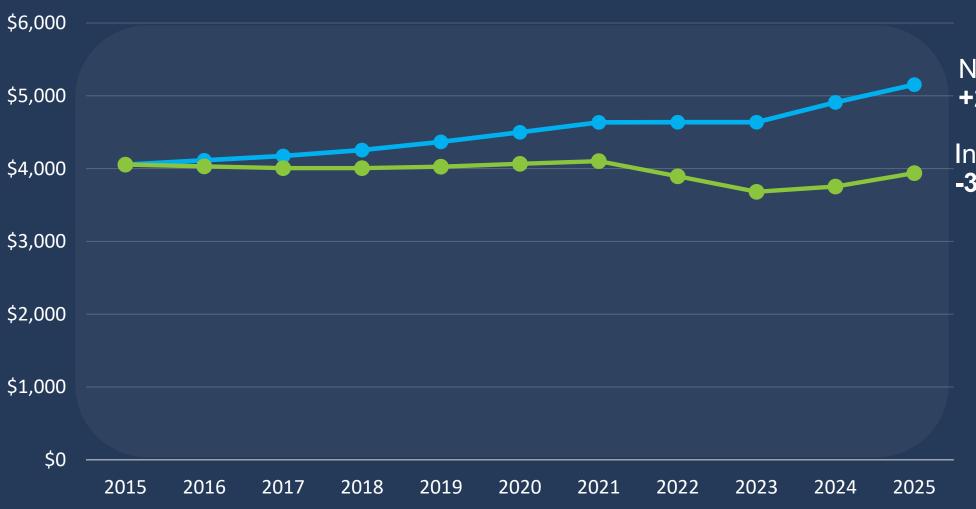

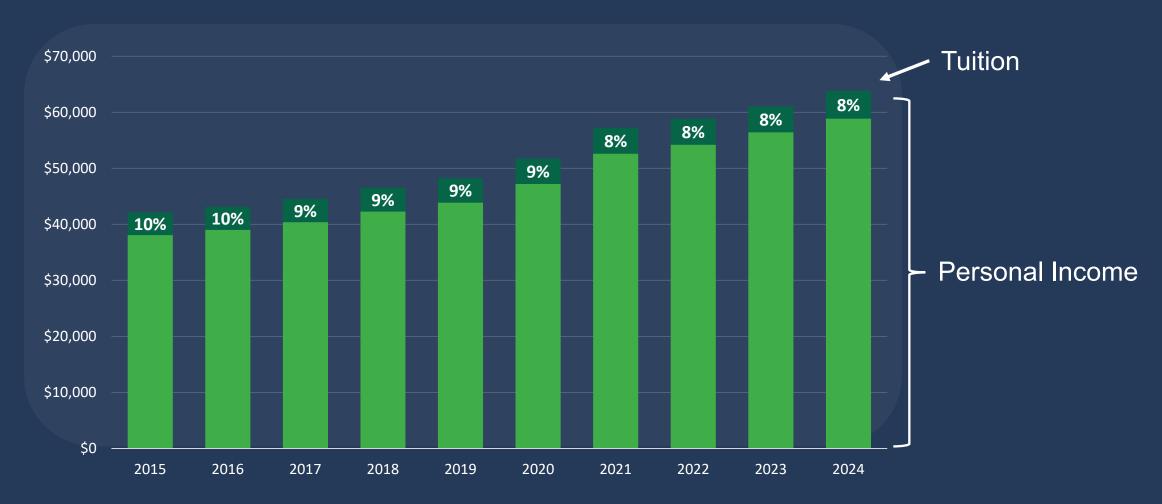

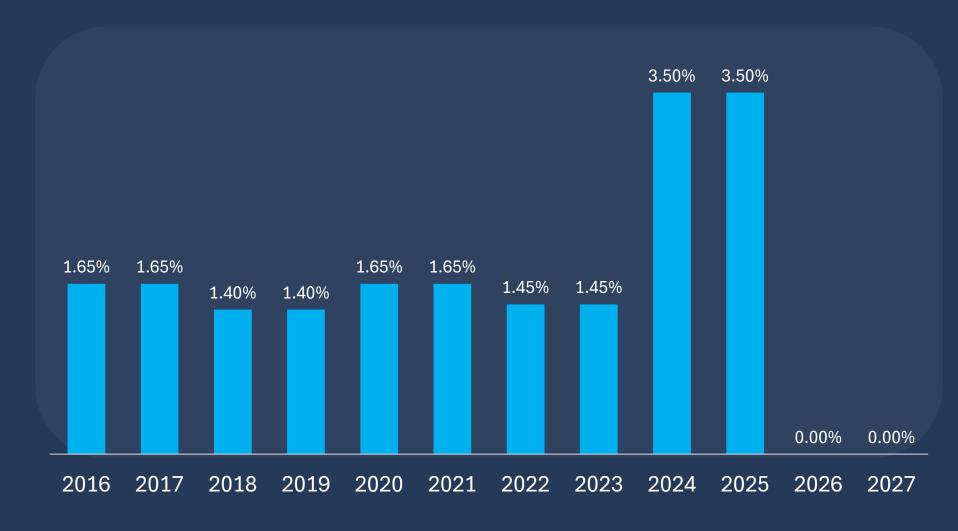
Tuition as % of Personal Income

Per Credit Textbook Cost





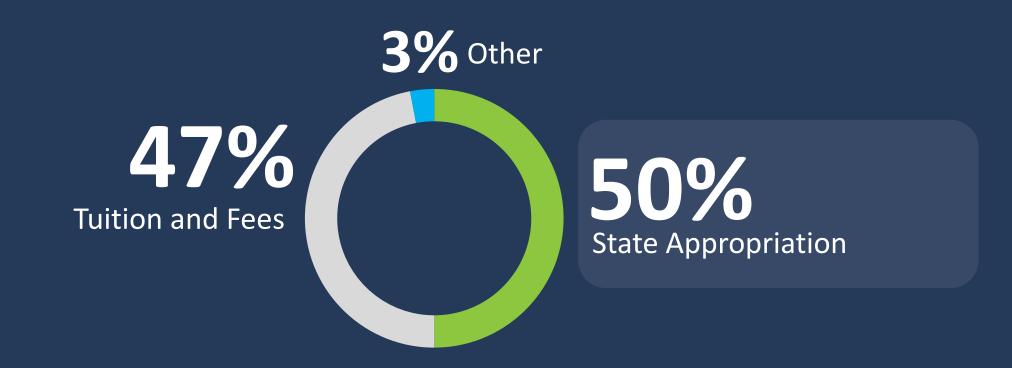

Bloomington and **Fort Wayne** each received \$10,000 from General Motors Community Impact Grant. Funds will support summer STEM camps at each campus 80 low-income middle and high school students.

Terre Haute received a grant from the GE Aerospace Foundation. The \$100,000 award will support the campus's School of Advanced Manufacturing, Engineering, and Applied Sciences in a myriad of ways, including short-term certificate trainings, scholarships for students, and marketing funds to help increase enrollment into the school's programs.

Systems Office was awarded \$600,000 from Axim Collaborative. Funds will be used to implement CredLens and Metaimpact technologies to streamline credential attainment reviews and better track student outcomes on third-party certification exams.

Indianapolis, Sellersburg, and Valparaiso each applied for Community Project Funding appropriations from their local congressional leaders. Each campus's projects are as follows:

- Indianapolis submitted a \$ 1,900,000 request to support the construction of a Flex Lab Workforce Training Center
- Sellersburg submitted a \$1,000,000 request to support the construction of the Perkins Technology Workforce Center
- Valparaiso submitted a \$1,000,000 request to support the demolition expenses of the Michigan City facility renovation project

Systems Office applied for \$997,450 from the Lowes Gable Grant to support Building and Construction Technology programming, including funds for student credential attainment, career exploration camps, and professional development for educators.

Non-competitive proposals include each campus's submission for the U.S. Department of Education Carl D. Perkins funding through the Indiana Commission for Higher Education.

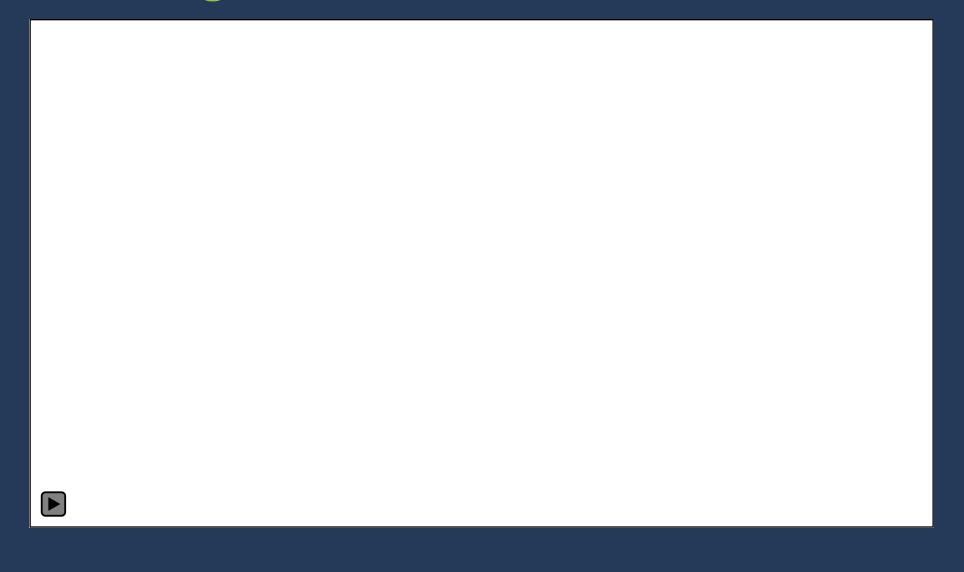

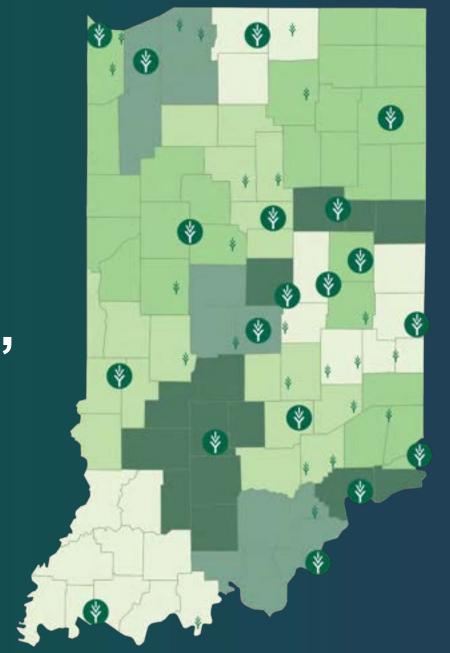

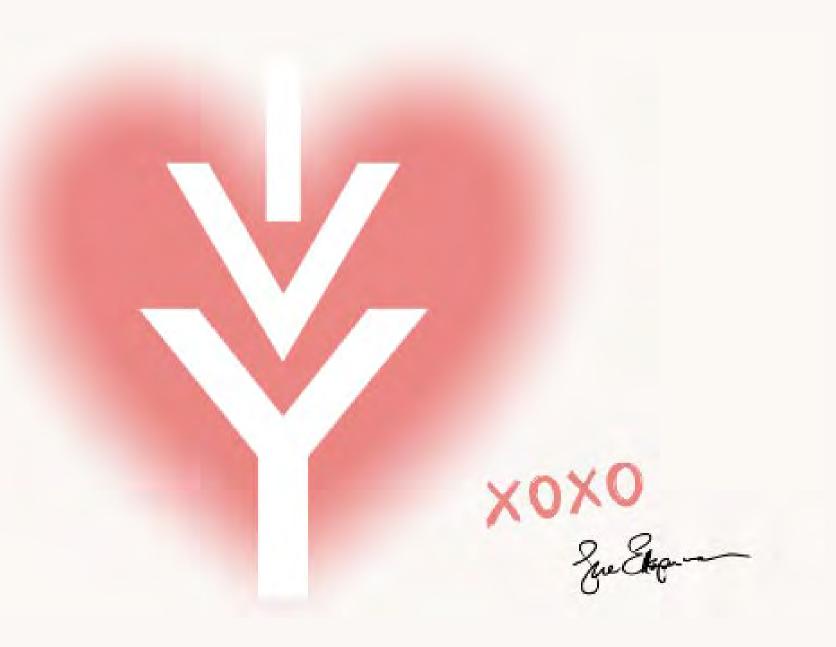
